Early Development Network Services

The network offers free year-round service coordination that will listen to you and respect your family.

Services may include, but not limited to:

- Services Coordination
- Special instruction
- Speech/language therapy
- Physical therapy
- Occupational therapy
- Psychological services
- Audiology/ Vision services
- Other services may be provided based on the needs and eligibility of the child and family.

What is Early Development Network Services Coordination?

Services Coordination means a central contact person, known as the services coordinator, is assigned to each family. Services Coordination helps families of children with special needs below age three.

Evaluation

A complete evaluation will look at your child's

- Thinking
- Play skills
- Movement
- Health development
- Talking and understanding
- Expressing emotion
- Social skills
- Self-care skills

How to get started

If you have questions about your child's development, the first step is to request an evaluation.

Anyone can request an evaluation, including parents, grandparents, doctors, nurses, social workers, daycare providers, or other professionals.

Who is Eligible?

Eligible families are those who have an infant or toddler below age 3 who qualifies for services because of a disability or developmental delay.
